Topic: Special Lecture on the new HMNS exhibit on Pompeii

When people hear "Pompeii," they immediately think of the disaster that befell the city in 79 AD. While this was indeed a tragedy for the good citizens of the city, it also presented a unique source for those among us who want to learn more about life in a Roman city in the first century AD. This presentation will look past the volcanic eruption and showcase the ways in which we have learned from Pompeii though murals, graffiti, inscriptions, and architecture.

Dirk Van Tuerenhout. Ph.D., Curator of Anthropology at the Houston Museum of Natural Science. Dr. Van Tuerenhout has taken part in excavations of Late Roman ruins in his native Belgium, and Maya ruins in Belize and Guatemala. Dr. Van Tuerenhout has a Master's degree in Ancient History and Archaeology, from the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven. Belgium, as well as a Ph.D. in Anthropology from Tulane University.
