Field Notes – Archeology along the Brazos

FBAS members investigated a vertical interface found in Pit L55. It appears as a straight line in the soil when looking at the bottom of the pit. It occurs when you are looking at the edge of a hole that was dug in the past and later filled in. After Pit L55 was completed, it was filled back in so that the team could go back over the immediate area using the ground penetrating radar (GPR). The idea was to do a more precise scan with the GPR and compare the results to what we learned from digging. A couple of anomalies were investigated and then new pits were laid out. FBAS volunteers dig every Saturday and welcome anyone who would like to help. If you are interested in joining, please contact us. No experience necessary – we will help train you with the proper methods of excavating!





Bruce explains the results of the GPR scan after he had a chance to interpret the data. He is shown here pointing out some anomalies to Bob on the left and John on the right.

Bruce and John use several tapes to lay out the exact coordinates of the next two pits we will work on. All of the pits are recorded onto a master site map.



John and Bruce drove a wooden stake into the ground to establish the corner of one pit. Orange tape is applied to help locate it later.



In addition to precisely establishing each corner of the new pits, the ground level at each pit is measured. This is done by comparing its elevation to a known point.
