Speakers: Bob Moore & Nancy Engelhardt-Moore

Topic: The Real Mulan: Yinxu and the Royal Tomb of Lady Fu Hao

Yinxu, which translates to the "Ruins of Yin" is one of the ancient capitals of China. It was the last capital of the Shang Dynasty that existed for 255 years. The city was rediscovered in 1899 and it is one China's largest archaeological sites and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is the source of the oracle bones that contain the earliest known Chinese writing as well as the earliest samples of Chinese animal-driven chariots. The site also has the best preserved Shang Dynasty royal tomb of Lady Fu Hao. She was a high



priestess, wife and military leader of King Wu Ding. This amazing women was the most powerful Shang general of her time. Her intact tomb contained the skeletal remains of 6 dogs and 16 slaves, and 1,928 artifacts including her large battle ax.

Bio: *Bob Moore* is a Certified Financial Planner who also loves travel, history and archaeology. He graduated from Michigan Technological Institute with degrees in geology and computer science. He earned his CFP through the University of Houston. Bob is the Chair of the HGMS Archaeology Section and regularly speaks on a variety of archaeological topics.

Bio: *Nancy L. Engelhardt-Moore* is a geologist/paleontologist who has a fascination for travel, photography, history and archaeology. She graduated from the University of Wisconsin: Whitewater with a BA in Fine Art and from Northern Illinois University with a MS in Geology/Micropaleontology. Bob and Nancy are both Mentor Docents, and participate in both paleontological and archaeological digs around the world for the HMNS and Burpee Museum of Natural History. In addition, Nancy has coauthored numerous scientific papers and has been in National Geographic documentaries.
