The cemetery association for the Wallis Cemetery in Austin County was looking for help with their site. The association has done a beautiful job with recent improvements of the cemetery by trimming trees and placing gravel on its roads. The association was looking for help to identify where some possible unmarked graves may be. A site plan identifies a small area where some graves may be. Stories handed down confirm they may exist. FBAS members, who are also with the Fort Bend County Historical Commission Cemetery Committee, used their ground penetrating radar to search for any evidence of the possible graves. Research is ongoing before any final determination about the site can be made.
