

## **Field Notes**

**Excavation Site** — Work is progressing at the historic homesite near Richmond where we are currently excavating. FBAS volunteers dig every Saturday morning. Want a closer look? Anyone is welcome to visit the site. You can join us or just come out to watch! Work begins at 9:00 am.





In the top left image, Bruce Grethen is getting deep in the newest pit that we've recently opened up. Soon he won't be able to reach the bottom and will have to dig while standing in the adjacent pit. He's digging to locate the southern wall of the root cellar we're investigating. On the right, is a small porceliene doll's leg found in our excavation of the root cellar





On the left, you can see a horizontal line between the light and dark colored soils just above the trowel. The line represents the floor of the root cellar. The darker soil was below the floor. In the right hand image is a 12" diameter ash pit on the floor of the root cellar. The pit actually goes below the floor about two and a half inches.
